**2017 Catholic Stewardship Appeal** – Recently reports that we approached our \$34,000 goal by 96.8%, gifting \$32,910 from 87 donors or 34.5% of our membership; many thanks; the Appeal itself exceeded it's \$7.7 million goal, reaching a generous level of \$7,952,324 from 31,400 donors Archdiocesan-wide; thanks for our part in this success!

**Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children** – The Catholic Church annually observed a long-standing custom referred to as "Respect Life Sunday" in October with Masses themed & focused on the right of every human person to life from the moment of conception to natural death. Some years ago this observance was enhanced by a *Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children*, coinciding with January 22, 1973 date of the US Supreme Court decision to liberalize traditional Judeo-Christian position against direct abortion; this also now coincides with the annual March for Life in Washington DC that has helped make clear and evident that opposition to abortion isn't only found in appreciable segments of all religious faiths but also in significant, at-large secular public population, so much so that reliable consensus indicates return to providing moral safeguards for all innocent life from conception to natural death is increasingly more deeply popular and desired by a vast majority of Americans.

**Christian Unity** – When I was a youngster I grew up in a very Catholic/Lutheran neighborhood, so much so that nearly every conversation was an ecumenical dialogue! Not that we were always talking religion – we didn't – but often and interestingly enough the topic came up. For example: one of my boyhood friend's older sisters was my babysitter from a fervent Wisconsin Synod Lutheran family. Of course, when the time came for the joy of her wedding, we good neighbors, despite being "heathen Catholic" in the eyes of their pastor, were invited to share in the special joys of the marriage ceremony and following secular festivities. We were cautioned not to draw attention to ourselves by doing or saying "Catholic things," like looking for holy water with which to sign ourselves, genuflecting, or mispronouncing "Amen," lest their pastor notice us and later call out our hosts, his church members, for encouraging a 'fraternization' of which he would not have approved! We behaved, but the fraternization then frowned upon in church was already well under way in the worlds of home, school, work, family, friendship and neighborhood. One of my other Lutheran neighbors (also Wisconsin Synod) was always asking me about Catholic things he didn't understand and found hard to accept; I went back to school, asked the priests and the nuns teaching my class (the Class of 1967 just had our fiftieth anniversary this past year) his questions and got back to him; while he grunted, I grew and I give him partial credit for my interest in religion that eventually became a vocation to priesthood! People of all faiths, especially our Christian sisters and brothers, can and do have a marvelous influence on our spiritual journey as we upon theirs. While diverse in tradition and practice, there is much in common that unites us; better we emphasize that, for God's honor and glory!
