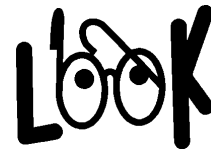

From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

Blessed Candles for Home Use – Will be available after all Masses next weekend for \$3 or more free-will offering per candle for as long as our supplies last; take advantage of this opportunity!

The Blessing of Throats – Through the intercession of St. Blasé, bishop and martyr, will be offered at the conclusion of all Masses next weekend as his feast day is on Saturday, February 03. According to legend, he was Bishop of Sebaste, Armenia around 300AD; during persecution, he withdrew and hid in a cave until a hunting party discovered his hiding place. He was arrested, imprisoned, tortured and finally beheaded in 316AD. While in prison, he healed a boy with a fishbone stuck in his throat. While considered the patron of throat diseases by the 6th century and numbered among the 14 Holy Helpers (group of saints honored together as “helpers in need” and invoked against a great variety of ills and troubles from headaches to sudden death; this group included three bishops - Denis, Erasmus (aka: Elmo), and Blasé; three virgins - Barbara, Margaret, and Catherine of Alexandria; three knightly patrons – George Achatius, and Eustace; then individually Giles, Pantaleon, Cyriac, Vitus, and Christopher), the blessing of throats as we now know it first began in the 16th century.

Catholic Schools Week – Began this weekend and is observed throughout this coming week. I was pleased as well as surprised to be able to attend the 50th Anniversary of my grade school class of 1967 from then Mother of Perpetual Help Catholic School in North-west Milwaukee (now merged and known as Blessed Savior); most of the ladies & men in attendance did not readily recognize each other as we were in gender-differentiated classes throughout our time there as it was the outlook of the Franciscan Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother that girls and boys both learned more effectively if not too “distracted” by the other! Once our eyes were opened, we saw the eager young faces of many classmates still shining in the eyes of many career people recently or readying themselves to retire; they were quite surprised to find that priests can first retire at age 68 and that many of us serve into our middle 70's. Along with the great diversity of excellent careers and lives of service represented, I was also impressed by how many still counted themselves as active, practicing Catholics, with children raising their grandchildren in the same walk of faith as they had taken; many were involved as volunteers in their respective parish communities; three of us became priests out of a class of over 80! Jesus once said we are able to know the goodness of a tree by its' fruit; the class of 1967 bore good fruit and I am sure that classes to come in all our Catholic schools will continue bearing good fruit!

Complication, Coincidence or Calling – The first day of Lent this year happens to fall on the largely secularized but, for Catholics, the enchantingly romantic and spiritual observance of St. Valentine's Day! It seems when a celebration like St. Patrick's Day or another popular observance falls on a Lenten day for fast and/or abstinence, there can be popular outcry for a dispensation releasing us from the spiritual disciplines of a good Lent in favor of our secular festivity. Ash Wednesday is one of only two days in the Catholic liturgical year (along with Good Friday) that is to be marked by the observance of **both** fasting and abstinence! A little “delayed gratification” will be good for the soul!
