Sunday, February 18, 2018 *1st Sunday of Lent *

From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

Fasting and Abstinence for Lent – Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent including Good Friday. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is taken; two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength and health may be taken according to personal needs, but together should not equal one full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids (milk, fruit juice, etc.) are allowed. When health or the ability to work would be adversely affected, the law does not oblige. To casually disregard these minimum practices is considered grave matter; going to Mass every Sunday, doing acts of charity, forgiveness and good deeds of virtue are obligations of daily life for Catholics, especially during Lent.

The Feast of the Chair of Peter the Apostle – Is observed this Thursday and, as it coincides with the civic observance of the birthday of our first president, George Washington in 1732, invites us to reflect upon leadership in the church. While physical reminders of Peter's leadership remain from his time with the church at Rome, specifically a chair that he was believed to have used in a house where he stayed (now preserved in Bernini's monumental altar at the west end of St. Peter's Basilica) and the wooden table on which he celebrated the Mass while there (now preserved in the Church of St. John Lateran, Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Rome, encased in an altar of marble with the original wood still visible), what is of more significance is the apostolic authority as derived from apostolic witness. What the Apostles saw and handed on is the core of what we call apostolic tradition; this is a great deal more than doctrine; it is a power and a way of life which cannot be delimited to doctrines that are encapsulated in a catechism. Peter and the Apostles showed the early church the way to Christian conflict resolution, forgiveness and the concern to be manifest for people marginalized by society, transmitting who we are in Christ by how we deal with each other as well as the problems of life; it is our lives, in fact, that truly reveal what we believe. The "keys of the kingdom" are not used to lock people out but to let people into the experience of God's kingdom as Jesus proclaimed it by how we exist as a community, how we live and deal with one another in love.

Catholic Stewardship Appeal 2017 – Provided a final report of our generosity as just short of annual goal of \$34,000 by \$1,090, total gift of \$32,910 being 96.79% of goal from 87 donors representing 34.52% of our registered members; thank you! My prayerful goal for us during this year's campaign would be to try meeting our financial goal this year by raising our percentage of participation. Every gift, no matter how small, makes a difference because we're all in it together; if you haven't been able or haven't decided to give in the recent past because you can only afford \$5, \$10, etc., your gift and participation are just as important as those blessed to be able to give proportionately more; I'd like to see us not only make goal but have even more of us share the achievement! The 2017 Catholic Stewardship Appeal was blessed with \$8,114.225.47 from 31,531 donors raised on a goal of \$7.7 million; while the dollars and cents are cause for some celebration, the participation of many more small donors, in the spirit of a widow's mite, would be cause for greater joy! I received my mailing, increased my gift, and returned it this past week; can we, can I, count on you, too?
