Sunday, February 25, 2018 * 2nd Sunday of Lent *

From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

I'm Honored – To have been asked to offer daily *Lenten Devotionals* on WTKM Radio 104.9FM in Hartford during the week of March 05-10. Recorded earlier, they'll be aired twice daily at 7:50AM and 5:50PM, so I hope you'll tune in!

Our Cemeteries – One of options for the prayer accompanying the distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday to begin a holy Lent still reads: *"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."* While not as frequently employed as the gospel injunctions of Our Lord, *"Repent, and believe in the Gospel,"* it still serves to remind us of our mortal frailty, despite the desires of some to put off the topic. Our parish cemeteries provide options for the dignified placement of what remains of our bodies in accord with our faith and what the church deems reverent committal. We have three cemeteries that provide for in-ground burial of either embalmed remains in caskets with vaults or cremated remains that are in an urn; if the urn is made of material considered breakable, then it must be placed within a vault for burial; if an urn is made of un-breakable material, then a vault is not required or necessary. By comparison with secular or non-sectarian cemeteries, our costs are considerably more reasonable as we view our cemeteries as a ministry and a service, not for more profit than necessary to sustain their maintenance and care. Can Catholics be cremated? While the Church earnestly recommends that the pious custom of burying the dead be observed, yes, the bodies of Catholics may be cremated. Cremation is permitted as long as it's not been chosen for reasons contrary to Christian teaching, i.e. to ridicule or protest against our belief in the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Families do not need to ask for church permission for a loved one to be cremated. The ashes must be placed in a grave or niche in a mausoleum known as a columbarium. They are never to be kept in the possession of the family or scattered, since these practices are not the reverent disposition that our faith envisions or requires. While some may prefer the body be present for the visitation and the funeral Mass (good numbers of loved ones and friends feel their farewells are somehow more complete when this is done), cremating the body after Mass, this may not always be practical or possible. In such cases, the ashes should be present for the funeral Mass; if that's not possible for some reason, a few of the ritual prayers usually a part of a Funeral Mass can either be adjusted or not be used in the absence of the remains of the loved one.

Open for a Left Hook – May 21, 2005, Andrew Golata fought Lamon Brewster for the WBO heavyweight boxing title. Golata was a strong fighter with a powerful punch, had 38 wins, 5 losses, and 31 knockouts. To prepare for the fight, Brewster studied tape of Golata's boxing, looking for an opening. He noticed that the way Golata held his hands left him open for a left hook. A few seconds into the first round, Brewster found an opening and threw a left hook. Golata went down to the mat and got up. Brewster threw another left hook and Golata went down again. He stood up and the fight resumed. Brewster threw another left hook to the same opening, and Golata went down for the third time, which counted as a knockout! Lamon Brewster won the fight in the first round because he was a smarter fighter. All he had to do was pound on his opponent's weakness. Similarly, Satan is looking to pound on our weakest area; when we leave an opening by yielding to temptation, he'll take advantage and throw a left hook. But if we do not yield to a temptation, that area is closed Satan's opportunity is cut off!
