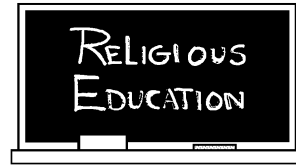
# Sunday, March 4, 2018 \* 3rd Sunday of Lent \*

## From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

**Dispensations** – Occasionally when social events become complicated by religious observances/practices, people are prone to ask pastors for a “dispensation,” a relaxation of particular disciplines or practices by way of a permission that is properly granted by a competent authority. Often such requests are for dispensation from the Lenten disciplines of fast/abstinence from meat on Fridays or from the obligation to attend a Sunday Mass due to already being at a Mass for a wedding or funeral the same weekend. First, a reminder: asking a pastor, priest, or deacon for a dispensation is barking up the wrong tree as they are **not** the competent church authorities to grant them; the competent authority is the (arch) diocesan bishop! Second, every (arch) bishop varies in willingness to extend or not extend dispensations. For example, when Cardinal Dolan was our Archbishop, he very popularly granted a dispensation from Lenten fast and abstinence when St. Patrick's Day fell on a Lenten Friday; do you think that maybe himself being more than a wee bit Irish had something to do with it!? Archbishop Listecki is less inclined to such as he declined to dispense us from fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday even though, as some noted, it was also St. Valentine's Day. One matter that our Archbishop's have all agreed upon is that attendance at a wedding or funeral **does not** fulfill one's Sunday obligation and is not sufficient reason to request a dispensation. Personally, I think seeking dispensation from what one might consider basic minimum Catholic obligations (compared to stricter, former days) is a way in which we, without much thought, actually put God and religion in places and positions secondary to where God and they truly ought to be. If, as catechism says, our purpose here on earth is to come to know, love and serve God so as to live with him forever in heaven, then putting shopping, athletic practices and competitions, in short, life's extracurricular offerings, ahead of going to Sunday Mass and learning of heaven's blessings through its' foretaste and promise in the Eucharist may be a consequence of an overly dispensational mentality; we at times see ourselves as more exceptional than we are when we make more exceptions for ourselves than what is due the greater honor and glory of God, setting aside the divine ordinances in favor of mere human preferences and traditions; maybe it is time that we begin to re-learn how to put first things first! If we sincerely want not to lose the influence of the spiritual in the secular, then we must first adhere and oblige ourselves to it in both hearts and lives. Before we go around saying what society ought to do, we ourselves should do what God commands, wants us to do – first things first, and then all things shall be ours besides!
