**From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):**

**Being Judged** – Is something we are, in these times, ultra-sensitive about; we dislike it when we or others get judged on appearances of age, allegations, gender, position, possessions, productivity, reputation, success, status, etc. We not only thoroughly dislike it ourselves, but we also mistrust those appointed to apply given standards to activities or situations, ready to call out those entrusted this difficult task for not including sufficient consideration for minorities, women, LGBTQI, special needs people, us, etc.; there is much to commend some of this indignation! However, while concentrating on proper restraint of judgment, we can too easily forget that God is our judge and we are daily under the divine gaze. While God so loved the world that He sent His only Son and doesn't desire to condemn but to save us, our own belief/unbelief, our good deeds or lack thereof, already judge us; in short, while Jesus is a most merciful Judge, we are probably our own worst judges; we go along, thinking and doing just as we please, sometimes giving ourselves exceptions from clearly enunciated divine ordinances, hoping we'll have time at the end of our lives to say we're sorry and get all that we've done, in spite of what God willed, forgiven. While I have no doubt in the generous extent and quality of God's mercy (God knows I'll need it), I also don't doubt God expects sorrow that is sincere, not manipulative or a game. To depend on God's generous mercy without attention to the need we have to repent does strike me as risky, boastful, and presumptuous. While there will be a particular judgment at the end of our lives and final judgment at the end of time, each day we are busy judging ourselves, sometimes preferring darkness of sin to the light of truth, sometimes doing things our own way over letting our deeds be clearly seen as being done in God. The most blessed words we could hope to hear at life's fulfillment would be "Come, you blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" while the worst possible words could find us outside and knocking at the door of heaven's wedding feast, only to hear from inside "Amen, I say to you, I do not know you."

**What's the Most Moving Part of Celebrating Holy Week?** – Well, for me, on **Holy Thursday** it is washing the feet of twelve parishioners, experiencing how humbling it was for Our Lord to wash the Apostles' feet of the Twelve to show them what true love is about, along with sharing this Mass in special ways with our First Communion candidates; on **Good Friday** it is watching the Veneration of the Cross as the long lines of worshippers approach the Cross, touching it in a great and reverent variety of ways, with a caress, a kiss, an embrace, a genuflection, a profound bow, a look of amazement, and all done in silent wonder at the greater love no one has than to lay down one's life for a friend, and Jesus considered us, while still sinners, His friends; on **Holy Saturday** I feel like we're inside the tomb when the spark of new fire lights the Easter Candle in an otherwise darkened church, followed by lighting people's individual candles so that, in shared light, the darkness of sin, suffering and death is pierced by the Light Who is the Risen Christ and we burst into song as we acclaim what our faith is all about – this is very emotional for me inside even though each priest has to maintain some bits of composure in order our fulfill priestly roles – I'm also very moved by young adults who choose to join the church in and through the Sacraments of Initiation – they are a hope for the church today and tomorrow; on **Easter Sunday** I'm always moved by how many people, especially and including those who don't often attend, actually do come – I find myself praying that the gifts of faith within the church community may help some of its' members recover from their spiritual numbness to feel again the sheer joy and love of God through Jesus and to choose or re-consider reactivating themselves as living, participating, active parts of the Body of Christ. Simply put, Holy Week, the Sacred Triduum, isn't to be missed as it contains all of what it means to be Catholic, Christian, and intentional disciples, followers of the Lord Jesus Christ – let's not ask ourselves, "Were You There?" Let's be there, trembling with sheer joy!
