### From the Team Moderator's Desk: (Father Rick):

**Trustee Election** – In accord with Wisconsin State Statute 187.19 which stipulates that our trustees are to be elected “from and by the congregation,” I hereby announce election to be held May 12-13, 2018. John Bingen, our present trustee-treasurer, completes his term of office on June 03, 2018. As he is willing to serve an additional two-year term, I hereby place his name in nomination. Additional candidates are welcome, but must be nominated in writing by ten or more registered parishioners; candidates must be Catholic, registered, practicing parish members, and at least 25 years old. Nomination forms are available in church lobby and on-line for anyone interested. Nominations close on April 27, 2018 @ 4:30PM; candidates will be announced at Masses May 05-06; if there is only one candidate, they are then declared elected.

**Cross v. Crucifix for Good Friday** – Sometimes our learning is more fruitful after we experience an occasion in which a question comes up. The question that occurs most frequently after our Good Friday services is which should be used for the veneration, a cross or a crucifix? Let's start with the word “veneration.” The revised translation of the Roman Missal corrected that word, which now reads “adoration.” That's one powerful word! Now the full title of the action is “The Adoration of the Holy Cross,” no longer “The Veneration of the Holy Cross.” Throughout this part of the Good Friday liturgy, the rubrics unflinchingly refer to the object of our adoration as a “cross;” they never use the word for a “crucifix.” At the end of the Good Friday services, before the ministers depart the sanctuary, they do not bow to the altar, nor do they genuflect toward the tabernacle. Instead, they genuflect to the cross. This is a powerful gesture! Good Friday imbues the cross with a sacred presence, as if our cross is the very cross on which Jesus died. It is the instrument of the entire Paschal Mystery and our salvation. It is stained with the blood of Christ. The rubrics of the New Roman Missal treat the cross as they treat the Blessed Sacrament – but only on Good Friday. The confluence of this day with the instrument of Christ's suffering makes the cross the holiest object in the church building. A crucifix, by contrast, is a sacramental worthy of veneration. It shows an image of Jesus dying. But on Good Friday we are not venerating an image of Jesus; instead, we adore the cross on which He died. Note that as the cross is carried into church in procession, we sing, “Behold the wood of the cross,” not “Behold an image of the dying Jesus.” Of that wood we sing, “Come, let us adore!” Granted, some people may personally prefer a crucifix; however, the Roman Missal which guides our worship presents something else. The empty cross speaks as loudly as the empty tomb!

**A Light Touch** – Two friends were conversing over coffee while reading the paper. One said, “Can you believe this? 50% of high school seniors think Sodom and Gomorrah were married!” The other replied, “Oh, my God! Everyone knows they were just living together!”

**If We Want to Change Our Tomorrow** – We have to start with today, because today becomes tomorrow very quickly.
