From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

The World Day of Prayer for Vocations – Will be observed next week-end. Kindly keep St. Peter's seminarians, Nick Dhein and Brady Gagne in your prayers, along with Megan Carl, our candidate for religious life with the Missionaries of Charity founded by St. Teresa of Calcutta. They and their families deeply appreciate your support and kindness!

Hospitalized Parishioners - As well as those institutionalized for rehabilitation or long-term personal care are hereby reminded that hospitals and other facilities are prevented by HIPPA laws and regulations from notifying us directly of your admission into their care unless you specifically direct that they do so; many of these institutions entrust making these requested notifications to a chaplain or a volunteer, and this often results in our being told only a considerable number of days after your admission, then only to find you've been discharged and HIPPA again prevents them from telling us where, making our follow-up challenging, confusing, sometimes nigh impossible. If you've been in-patient at a hospital, rehabilitation center, or placed in a long-term care facility and haven't seen me or someone else from the parish, we're not overlooking you; we simply did not know that you were there! Best practice? Have someone in your family give us a prompt notification in your name!

2018 Catholic Stewardship Appeal – Reports that as of April 02, we have already given/pledged **\$17,910** toward our goal of **\$33,000**, meaning that we've achieved nearly **54%** of our goal in slightly less than two months, thanks to **55** generous donors representing slightly over **22%** of our membership – thank you! The Archdiocese dropped a second Appeal reminder letter in the mail this past week; for those yet to and planning to give, I encourage your generosity! For those who have not given in quite a while or ever, I encourage your participation this year, even and especially if your gift may be small, because it makes your statement that you are part of church happening here in Allenton, as well as throughout the 10-County Archdiocese of Milwaukee. If you plan and make your gift soon, we won't need to incur expenses for an additional summer reminder letter. Overall, the Appeal has already received **\$4,349,579.86** from **18,598** donors toward an annual goal of **\$7.7** million. Thank you for your consideration and generosity!

Baptismal Sponsors – There has been a trend among Catholic parishes worldwide to implement more fully practices recommended in the Code of Canon Law with regard to a person's eligibility to be chosen as a sponsor for Baptisms, and Confirmation. The norms state that, in order to be chosen, the person must be a **practicing Catholic, at least 16 years old, Baptized/Received Into Full Communion with the Church, Confirmed, and, if married, their marriage is a valid/sacramental marriage (happened in a church before a priest/deacon and two witnesses unless dispensed by church authority)**. While many parishes/long-serving pastors have been trusting the word of parents and candidates, the mobility of family/friends as well as changeability & diminishing numbers of those who actually practice the faith as the church envisions it (going to Mass and Holy Communion every Sunday and Holyday of Obligation, frequenting the Sacrament of Penance as conscience needs, at least 1-2X annually) means that, even in otherwise close families and friendship circles, the current faith practice or sacramental status of a person being considered for the role of a sponsor may not be known to those desiring to choose them for this relationship in the life of the Church. For years we have asked for letters from parishes of their registered membership when Confirmation Sponsors are not known members here and, other than occasional concern when this well-known requirement is unduly delayed, it goes well. I am considering whether or not I may need to ask the same for Baptismal Sponsors in the future; while being pastor since 2002 means I know many to most families to some extent, the numbers of newcomers may necessitate that I reconsider this aspect. Just letting you know what I'm thinking ... your thoughts?
