First Communion Thought – As I prepare to administer the Sacrament of First Holy Eucharist to many second graders at both Resurrection Parish in Allenton (April 28) and St. Peter Parish in Slinger (May 05), I cannot help but notice the differences between theirs and mine: mine was received kneeling along the edge a communion rail that my chin was barely able to get over, presented in Latin (Corpus Christi) and on my tongue: theirs will be standing upright (except for a lovely little lady in a wheelchair @ Allenton), presented in prayerful vernacular either into their hand or on their tongue, and available under both species. While the appearances may seem to be so different, the substance will be the same as always – the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ under the forms of bread & wine for our spiritual help in the present and our hope for eternal salvation. When one thinks of these aspects as far more important, not much has changed after all!
