## From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

**Did You Know** – That a little over 100 years ago on April 26, 1919, “the beautiful new Sacred Heart Church at Allenton narrowly escaped destruction when flames were discovered issuing from the floor in the sanctuary? An alarm was immediately turned in and the volunteer fire department responded promptly, thus checking the flames before they had gained sufficient headway to endanger the entire structure. The damage therefore was slight and consisted of a small hole burned in the sanctuary floor. The Church, completed in May, 1917, is a beautiful piece of workmanship.”

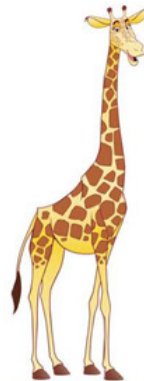
**Vocations** – Despite the fact that this Sunday is Mother's Day, Archbishop Listecki has directed and encouraged that our homilies focus on vocations to holy orders and religious life. Why this dissonance with secular festivities? Well, the biblical readings for this weekend's Masses speak of the Church as God's people, the sheep of His flock, gathered joyfully from every culture, nation, race and walk of life into unity with Christ by the Holy Spirit to worship Him, the Lamb once slain for us Who is now risen; He shepherds and tends us well, leading us into eternal life through sharing His relationship with God, His Father and ours. Commonly called GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY, it has been appropriate for Catholics to consider prayerfully and gratefully acknowledge the vocations of the men/women who nurtured our faith, who educated, counseled, encouraged and supported us; it is also appropriate to pray for a flowering of future vocations as the numbers of priests and sisters retiring from lives of devoted leadership and service still exceeds the number discerning and entering; we need to encourage, to support and to train quality leadership and service for the immediate as well as the long-term future good of the Church. Mothers have always seemed, at least to me, able to take long, loving looks forward in hope and see in lively, yet-to-be-focused energies and talents of their youngsters a significant difference and impact they may make on the quality of community life; they also have a tremendous love willing to sacrifice for the happiness of others; maybe that's why ...

**While Many Catholics** – Do not find themselves deterred from association with the Church due to the sex abuse crisis, saying anything from “who am I to judge” or “we're all fallible” and “no one is perfect,” there are others who are very furious, who hover near the door, think of exiting, some going elsewhere for spiritual food and guidance, others going nowhere as institutional churches all confront similar issues. In 2002, the onset of our awareness of the extent of the clergy sex crisis, 22% of Catholics were considering leaving the Church; in 2019, due to recent reported mishandlings, neglect, and lack of complete transparency about what was being done 'tween then and now to respond to the crisis, 37% of the Catholics surveyed said they were considering leaving the Church, saying things like “how can I go to the Church when I need moral guidance when its' authorities can't be trusted?” For many, a lot more must yet be done with how this crisis is being handled to change their minds, but I'm confident that Archbishop Listecki and Milwaukee Archdiocese are better than most when it comes to transparency, adherence to the Dallas Charter, & zero-tolerance. While agreeing at this moment that making right for a terrible past will take time, I am also confident that our faith is truly placed in the goodness of God, not the evil and sinful people can do – that is what keeps us faithful.

## Did You Know...

In 2018 in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, over **200 Safe Environment Education Sessions** were conducted, over **6,800 criminal background checks** were conducted on clergy, employees, and volunteers, and over **50,000 children** were trained in Safe Environment topics.
