From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):

October 02: Feast of the Guardian Angels – Common use of the term “angel,” when referring to people, who do us a kindness or help us, while certainly a term of endearment or appreciation, can also become part of a “slippery slope” into a less clear understanding of what the church teaches about angels. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says: “The existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls ‘angels’ is a truth of faith. The witness of Scripture is as clear as is the unanimity of Tradition. St. Augustine says: “Angel” is the name of their office, not of their nature. If you seek the name of their nature, it is “spirit”; if you seek the name of their office, it is “angel” “With their whole beings the angels are servants and messengers of God. Because they ‘always behold the face of my Father who is in heaven’ they are the ‘mighty ones who do his word, hearkening to the voice of his word. As purely spiritual creatures angels have intelligence and will: they are personal and immortal creatures, surpassing in perfection all visible creatures, as the splendor of their glory bears witness. From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. ‘Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life.’ Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God.” (CCC, No. 329, 330 and 336) Our guardian angels do more than protect us while we sleep or watch over us while we’re driving (we really cause them extra worry when we text or talk on our phones while doing so) or engaged in some other high risk situation. They give us “backbone” against onslaughts of a secular society so that we can remain bold in our consistent witness to the absolute God-given truths of our faith and have courage when we are challenged to conveniently compromise them. “Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God’s love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light, to guard, to rule and guide. Amen.”

October 14-15, 2017 – Will be the weekend for our annual **Fall Combined Collections for the Church in Mission**; there will be a special second collection or you may bring in your mailed envelope.

Respect Life Sunday – March 06, 1857, was a very dark day in American history. By a 7-2 vote, the US Supreme Court declared that Afro-Americans were not legal persons; rather, they were property that could be used, sold, beaten or killed. Slavery had been upheld. Fortunately, in 1868 the 14th Amendment to the US Constitution secured the rights of blacks to full personhood. Slavery was overturned, and the equality of all people before the law was upheld. Note that the law **did not give** blacks equality; they **always had it** because **GOD** had made them equal. What happened in the 14th Amendment was that the law recognized their God-given dignity and rights; human law was brought into line with divine law. Another dark day was January 22, 1973. By another 7-2 vote, the US Supreme Court said the 14th Amendment does not apply to children in the first nine months of life in their mother’s wombs, making abortion legal. Since then 37 million unborn children have lost their lives; the number killed on 09/11 was 3,000; the number killed in Hitler’s “final solution” Holocaust was some 6 million. We need to respect and protect all human life, to end what is seen by many as a selective interpretation of fundamental law. The Declaration of Independence asserts that the first right of people who are truly free is the right to life. We need laws consistent with the most fundamental of human rights. We need to give real care to mothers with unwanted pregnancies along with welcome and forgiveness for all who repent of a formal cooperation and participation in the sin of abortion. Pray for just laws & an end to abortion!
