**Month of the Rosary** – The Rosary grew out of the practice of reciting the Our Father and Hail Mary 150 times in a devotion that parallels the Liturgy of Hours (Breviary) in which all 150 Psalms were said. This devotion was current as early as the 12<sup>th</sup> century. The Dominican Order has a legend that the Rosary was given by Our Lady to St. Dominic as a weapon against heresy; although a vision was granted to him, it was not likely about the rosary in its' present form. Prior to 1483 only the first part of the Hail Mary was in common use; in time the 150 Our Fathers & Hail Mary's were reduced to one Our Father per 10 Hail Mary's. The number of events (mysteries) were also reduced from 150 to 15; now there's 20 (Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, & Luminous). The Rosary became more standardized in the 15<sup>th</sup> century, first approved in its' substantially present form in 1569 by Pope St. Pius V who added a second part to the Hail Mary ("Holy Mary, Mother of God ... etc.") and a "Glory Be" after each of the decades. This same Pope established a feast of *Our Lady of the Rosary* in thanksgiving for a victory against the Turks at Lepanto. The best analogy for why we ask Mary to pray for us is friendship. By becoming more "Marian" in spirit we bring ourselves more closely to the origins of the mysteries of the grace that she witnessed; then we can see it operating in our lives through eyes of friendship that share her faith, her fiat, her "yes" to God's will. Mary is exemplary in receptivity to God's will. Growing in that kind of faith will help us see Jesus in our lives as she did; that's why I'm so pleased that we offer opportunity to pray the Rosary together before Masses; I am thankful to our volunteer prayer leaders for keeping alive this tremendous practice. **From the Team Moderator's Desk (Father Rick):**

On September 27, 2017 – Pope Francis inaugurated a two-year global campaign in support of immigrants & refugees; coordinated nationally by Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Charities USA, and the Migration/Refugee Services offices of our national Bishop's Conference, it will be called *Share the Journey*. To launch this effort, Archbishop ListECKI and Fr. Javier Bustos (Vicar for Hispanic Ministry) visited two immigrant families for dinner to listen to their experiences & will meet with a group of DREAMERS during the Archdiocesan Hispanic Youth Encounter on October 14. In these very particularly challenging times, praying for and helping victims of earthquakes and hurricanes, with concern for urban racial unrest and violence in our cities, with escalating bellicose threats of war with nuclear overtones, and with many more injustices crying out for attention, help and prayer, it may be good to remind ourselves that many immigrants & refugees are the very people caught in the cracks of these situations and conflicts; many are unaccompanied children who travel in a dangerous world and find themselves victimized by modern forms of human slavery. Immigrants and refugees seek safety from violence, work to put food on the table for their families, and justice for what we all believe are God-given human rights which must be respected by every nation-state. Remembering that all of us, when one is inclined to look back generationally, are descendants of immigrants and refugees to these very shores, I invite you to pray especially for the immigrants and refugees of today. A special prayer for your use is inserted with this bulletin & I invite you to join Pope Francis, our US Bishops, and countless others to grow in love and concern for many who are among the least fortunate among us. In doing so, we will see Christ more clearly as He said that He is present in them and that whatever we do to them, for them, we do to Him, for Him (see Matthew 25:34-40).

**Back a Couple Centuries** – People began to abandon the religious belief that we live in a fallen world that needs God in the person of a Redeemer and preferred to think that we're just living in an imperfect society that we can improve by simply creating for ourselves better, new or improved social systems and technologies. All we need for significant improvement is a better plan or gadget, not the plan provided by divine grace or revelation. This kind of thinking has led us to some of the most violent centuries in recorded history among human beings as well as extremely combative politics as nations battle for control as to whose ideas and systems will assure us the perfect society. While a patriot loves their country with all their heart and soul, we must also offer for consideration the thought that our society will be at its' best only when we admit that we live in a fallen world and need God, not just ourselves, to make it great.
